Learning e.g. less information could be streamlined and to the point; people don't go off work and continue to be supported in Sri Lanka. Guidance on Homeworking and use of Display Screen Equipment For information at this stage:

As the government advice and restrictions during the COVID pandemic (to work from home where you can) are being lifted, we are currently reviewing our own guidance on homeworking and use of display screen equipment.

New/updated homeworking guidance including use of display screen equipment at home is currently being prepared and hopefully will be available on our web site next month.

The updated guidance will cover both workers who work at home (and use DSE equipment) on a permeant basis, but also where they routinely split their time working from both the home and office workplace (this is sometimes referred to as hybrid working).

We are also aiming to include infographics on what a good posture looks like for DSE use, and also information on good working practices (e.g. taking regular breaks etc).
