The successful applicant will be expanding the team of Clinical Professionals already in place.

About the Role:

As an IMR, you will:

- Conduct in-person medical assessments for former and serving police officers appealing decisions related to Injury on Duty (IOD) and III Health Retirement (IHR).

- Review evidence and submissions from the Northern Ireland Policing Board.

- Produce clear, evidence-based medical reports and/or certificates within a 10-day turnaround.

- Act in accordance with current regulations, including the Police Service of Northern Ireland and Reserve (Injury Benefit) Regulations 2006 and the Police Pensions Regulations (NI) 2015.

Essential Criteria:

- Minimum two years' experience as an Occupational Health Practitioner (AFOM, MFOM, FFOM, or EEA equivalent).

- GMC registration (with evidence of current validation/revalidation).
- Indemnity and insurance cover appropriate for medico-legal work.
- Willingness to undergo or currently hold Counter Terrorism Check (CTC) clearance.
- Excellent communication, report-writing, and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to attend Belfast offices on a regular basis to undertake the assessments.

Practical Info:

- The majority of assessments will be conducted face to face in Belfast, though paper reviews may occasionally be appropriate.

- You will be supported by an experienced administrative team and provided with access to relevant case documentation and guidance.
