Recent activities

We regularly meet with Government. For example, our Patron hosted an event in late 2016 at the House of Lords on the new health and work Green Paper. We correspond with policy makers, including the Secretary of State at the Department of Work and Pensions, and recently contributed to a BMA report on the occupational medicine workforce crisis. We followed this up by facilitating a question in parliament about the issue.

In 2016 we hosted a number of events, including an Occupational Medicine journal reviewers' workshop, appraiser training and webinars. We showcased occupational health through our partnership with the Royal Society of Medicine. SOM exhibits and speaks at conferences such as the Association of Directors of Public Health and Medical Council on Alcohol. A particular focus was on GPs, with a campaign targeted at informing them about occupational health

SOM recently launched a new student membership category and international regional group.
