What is OH?

Specialist field studying the interaction between work and health;

- Impact of work on health → prevention (primary, secondary and tertiary)
- Impact of health on work → fitness to work, fitness to practise, rehabilitation

Work on health

- Risk based approach
- Prevention
 - Vaccination
 - Health surveillance
- Identification
- Rehabilitation

Health on work

- Temporary or chronic health issue
- Fitness to work
 - Illness~ functions~ job requirements
 - Illness # unfit
- Rehabilitation
 - Unemployment is worse for health
 - Common sense

- Training and education

OH commissioning and delivery
